

Anointed Ones

Jesus presents himself for baptism in today's Gospel not because He is a sinner, but to fulfill the word of God proclaimed by His prophets. He must be baptized to reveal that He is the Christ ("anointed one")—the Spirit-endowed Servant promised by Isaiah in today's First Reading.

His baptism marks the start of a new world, a new creation. As Isaiah prophesied, the Spirit descends upon Jesus like a dove—as the Spirit hovered over the face of the deep in the beginning.

As it was in the beginning, at the Jordan also the majestic voice of the Lord thunders above the waters. The Father opens the heavens and declares Jesus to be His "beloved son." God had long prepared the Israelites for His coming, as Peter preaches in today's Second Reading. Jesus was anticipated in the "beloved son" given to Abraham, and in the calling of Israel as His "first-born son".

Jesus is the divine son begotten by God, the everlasting heir promised to King David. He is "a covenant of the people [Israel]" and "a light to the nations," Isaiah says. By the new covenant made in His blood, God has gathered the lost sheep of Israel together with whoever fears Him in every nation.

Christ has become the source from which God pours out His Spirit on Israelites and Gentiles alike. In Baptism, all are anointed with that same Spirit, made beloved sons and daughters of God. Indeed, we are Christians—literally "anointed ones." We are the "sons of God" in today's Psalm—called to give glory to His name in His temple. Let us pray that we remain faithful to our calling as His children, that our Father might call us what he calls His Son—"my beloved... in whom I am well pleased."

Meaning of our Baptism


What does your Baptism mean to you? At one level it may simply mean that we belong to the Church, are washed from original sin and able to receive the sacraments. Yes, all this is true. However, does this capture the full meaning?

Today's readings invite us to recognise that Baptism is a statement about our identity and responsibility in the world. We firstly notice in the gospel that Jesus submits to baptism, even though he had no need of baptism. Just like his crucifixion, he humbles himself, allowing himself to be considered as and united with sinners. He submits totally to the will of his Father.

In the same way, we too are invited to recognise that in and through baptism we are dying to our human nature with its will and passions. We are rising to our new life in Christ, a life which can be powered by the Holy Spirit as we become one with Jesus. Thus we too can hear the father say "This is my son (daughter), my beloved, my favour rests on you."

Isaiah, in our first reading, describes the way in which Christ—and thus ourselves—are meant to live out this identity. We live it out in humble service, following God's will and moving in the power of the Spirit, bringing justice and truth. Like Jesus we do this without fanfare, without force or domination. Rather, we accompany with gentleness and kindness, not breaking those who are crushed, nor quenching those who are struggling with weakness. *With and in Christ, through his Spirit, we become salt and light for the world.*

Celebrating the Baptism of the Lord at Home

A simple prayer for parish families

1. Prepare a Prayer Space

On a small table place:

- a candle
- a cross
- a bowl of water (*holy water if possible*)
- a Bible

2. Opening Prayer

Light the candle.

Loving Father,
we thank you for the gift of baptism.
As Jesus was baptised in the Jordan,
renew in us your love and grace.
May our home always belong to you.
Amen.

3. Remember Our Baptism

Each person dips a finger into the water and makes the Sign of the Cross, saying:
I am baptised. I belong to Christ.
Parents may trace the cross on their children's forehead.

4. Renew Our Baptismal Promises

Together say:

- Do you renounce sin and all that separates you from God? **I do.**
- Do you believe in God who loves and saves us? **I do.**
- Do you choose to follow Jesus each day? **I do.**

5. Short Family Prayer

Offer simple prayers for:

- our family
- our parish and community
- the sick, the elderly, and those in need

Lord, hear our prayer.

6. Closing Blessing

May the Father bless us,
may Jesus walk with us,
and may the Holy Spirit guide us.
Amen.
