

The Blessed Path

He is sent to lead a new exodus that brings Israel out of captivity to the nations and brings all the nations to God.

As Moses led Israel from Egypt through the sea to give them God's law on Mount Sinai, Jesus too has passed through the waters in baptism. Now, in today's Gospel, He goes to the mountain to proclaim a new law—the law of His Kingdom.

The Beatitudes mark the fulfillment of God's covenant promise to Abraham—that through his descendants all the nations of the world would receive God's blessings.

Jesus is the son of Abraham. And through the wisdom He speaks today, He bestows the Father's blessings upon "the poor in spirit."

God has chosen to bless the weak and lowly, those foolish and despised in the eyes of the world, Paul says in today's

Epistle. The poor in spirit are those who know that nothing they do can merit God's mercy and grace. These are the humble remnant in today's First Reading, taught to seek refuge in the name of the Lord.

The Beatitudes reveal the divine path and purpose for our lives. All our striving should be for these virtues—to be poor in spirit; meek and clean of heart; merciful and makers of peace; seekers of the righteousness that comes from living by the law of Kingdom.

The path the Lord sets before us today is one of trials and persecution. But He promises comfort in our mourning and a great reward.

The Kingdom we have inherited is no earthly territory but the promised land of heaven. It is Zion where the Lord reigns forever. And, as we sing in today's Psalm, its blessings are for those whose hope is in the Lord.

Reflecting on the Word of God

When and how do you reflect upon the scriptures, the bible? Perhaps you reflect on the readings each Sunday before coming to mass. Perhaps you might reflect on the daily readings using your missal or one of the many apps that are available.

It is only through reflecting on the Word of God that we can truly come to know, relate with and understand Jesus and his teachings. Indeed, understand St Jerome (347-420 AD) once said "ignorance of the scriptures is ignorance of Christ." It is through reflection on the scriptures that we can embrace the first part of our parish mission - knowing Jesus.

The following are two simple methods for scripture reflection:

Lectio Divina (Holy Reading) Meditation

1. Read: Slowly read the text without rushing, letting the text 'soak in' as you do so.

2. Meditate: Read the text again slowly and ask 'What sticks out for me?' It could be a word, a phrase, an image, one of the characters, one of the actions etc within the text. Sit with that word, phrase, image, emotion, etc., think it through and explore its meaning for you in your life. What might God be saying to you?

3. Prayer: Speak with God about what you've discovered. You may want to give thanks, ask forgiveness, seek strength or comfort, etc. Whatever you want to say to God which arises from the text itself.

4. Contemplation: Simply resting with God in silence, perhaps with the word or phrase that stuck out to you, simply repeating it slowly and quietly in your mind. Listen for God's response to your prayer.

SOAP

Another form of scripture reflection very similar to Lectio Divina.

S: Scripture - The text you are reading.

O: Observation - What do you see, hear and feel when you explore the text?

A: Application - What is this text asking you to do, what response is called for?

P: Prayer - What would you like to talk with God about from your reading?


A Kingdom Charter

The Beatitudes are the charter of Jesus' kingdom. They begin with a surprise: God's favour already rests on the poor in spirit, the grieving, the gentle, the justice-hungry, the merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers, and those who cop the cost for doing right.

These are not a bunch of hurdles to clear; they are nine announcements of grace. At the same time, they sketch the character of a community that looks like Jesus. The Church is called to become a new social world where mercy is normal, truth is spoken in love, and conflict becomes an opportunity for honest peacemaking rather than point-scoring.

Zephaniah points to the remnant—humble people who take refuge in God and practice truth; Paul reminds us that God chose the ordinary so that we boast only in the Lord. In other words, the Beatitudes are for us: **ordinary apprentices and students learning to follow Jesus, here and now.**

This week, choose one Beatitude and practice it intentionally: comfort someone who mourns; resist the urge to dominate; repair a relationship; offer mercy; make peace. Then tell someone why you did it: because you're learning to know, follow and share Jesus with your neighbours. That's how the kingdom becomes visible: quietly, steadily, beautifully.

New Catechists Needed

Our Parish needs new volunteer catechists to teach Special Religious Education (SRE) to roughly 400 Catholic children who attend 5 Government State Primary Schools in our Parish.

What's involved:

1. Attendance at the Catechist Level 1 course starting 6 February; a 5 week free course held at Rosemeadow.
2. Completion of a working with children check with Service NSW (free for volunteers)

The classes are once weekly for 30 to 45 minutes. New catechists will start as helpers with experienced teachers and won't be pushed to teach by themselves until they feel confident.
