READINGS NEXT WEEK – Sixth Sunday in the Year (A)

Sirach 15:15-20; 1 Corinthians 2:6-10; Matthew 5:17-37

Light Breaking Forth

As His disciples, we too are called to be "the light of the world," He tells us in the Gospel this Sunday (see John 1:4-4, 9; 8:12; 9:5).

All three images that Jesus uses to describe the Church are associated with the identity and vocation of Israel.

God forever aligned His kingdom with the kingdom of David and his sons by a "covenant of salt," salt being a sign of permanence and purity (see 2 Chronicles 13:5, 8; Leviticus 2:13; Ezekiel 43:24).

Jerusalem was to be a city set on a hill, high above all others, drawing all nations toward the glorious light streaming from her Temple (see Isaiah 2:2; 60:1-3).

And Israel was given the mission of being a light to the nations, that God's salvation would reach to the ends of the earth (see Isaiah 42:6; 49:6).

The liturgy shows us this week that the Church, and every Christian, is called to

fulfill Israel's mission.

By our faith and good works we are to make the light of God's life break forth in the darkness, as we sing in this week's Psalm.

This week's readings remind us that our faith can never be a private affair, something we can hide as if under a basket.

We are to pour ourselves out for the afflicted, as Isaiah tells us in the First Reading. Our light must shine as a ray of God's mercy for all who are poor, hungry, naked, and enslaved.

There must be a transparent quality to our lives. Our friends and family, our neighbors and fellow citizens, should see reflected in us the light of Christ and through us be attracted to the saving truths of the Gospel.

So let us pray that we, like St. Paul in the Epistle, might proclaim with our whole lives "Christ, and him crucified."

4. **Be Reconciled** - go to Confession at the start of Lent (don't wait for Holy Week)
5. **Fast Intentionally** - give up one thing that you love, not something trivial
6. **Practice Almsgiving** to the needy
7. Read a great book
8. Pray the Stations of the Cross
9. **Focus on Love**

Salt and Light: A Call to Visibility

There's something uncomfortably clear about today's Gospel. Jesus doesn't whisper suggestions. No, he makes declarations: "You are the salt of the earth. You are the light of the world."

Not try to be. Not might become someday.

You are.

This is both gift and responsibility. Salt that loses its taste is useless. A lamp hidden under a basket serves no one. Our faith, Jesus implies, was never meant to be private. It's inherently visible, active, outward-facing.

But what does this look like in daily life? Isaiah gives us a clue: share your bread with the hungry, shelter the homeless, clothe the naked, and refuse to turn away from your own flesh and blood.

These aren't extraordinary heroics reserved for saints. They're the ordinary choices of people who take their baptism seriously. In our multicultural community, opportunities abound. The elderly neighbour who needs groceries. The newcomer family navigating an unfamiliar culture. The colleague struggling silently. Each encounter is a chance to shine—not through grand gestures, but through attentive presence and practical kindness.

Paul reminds us we don't need eloquence or impressive credentials. We simply need authenticity and willingness. The power isn't ours anyway; it's God's, working through our weakness.

This week, ask yourself: Where can I be salt? Where can I be light? You might be surprised how even small flames transform the darkness around you.
