How God Loves

We often begin Mass with the prayer from today's Epistle: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." We praise the God who has revealed Himself as a Trinity, a communion of persons.

Communion with the Trinity is the goal of our worship—and the purpose of the salvation history that begins in the Bible and continues in the Eucharist and sacraments of the Church.

We see the beginnings of God's self-revelation in today's First Reading, as He passes before Moses and cries out His holy name. Israel had sinned in worshipping the golden calf (see Exodus 32). But God does not condemn them to perish. Instead He proclaims His mercy and faithfulness to His covenant.

God loved Israel as His firstborn son among the nations. Through Israel—heirs of His covenant with Abraham—God planned to reveal Himself as the Father of all nations.

The memory of God's covenant testing of Abraham—and Abraham's faithful obedience—lies behind today's Gospel.

In commanding Abraham to offer his only beloved son, God was preparing us for the fullest possible revelation of His love for the world.

As Abraham was willing to offer Isaac, God did not spare His own Son but handed Him over for us all.

In this, He revealed what was only disclosed partially to Moses—that His kindness continues for a thousand generations, that He forgives our sin and takes us back as His very own people

Jesus humbled Himself to die in obedience to God's will. And for this, the Spirit of God raised Him from the dead, and gave Him a name above every name.

This is the name we glorify in today's Responsorial: the name of our Lord, the God who is Love.

Joining the Trinity's Dance

Trinity Sunday invites us into one of the deepest mysteries of our faith—but not as a puzzle to solve. Instead, it is an invitation to experience God.

In Exodus, God reveals himself as “merciful and gracious, slow to anger.” This is not abstract theology; it’s a personal revelation. God wants to be known as loving and faithful. St Paul echoes this in his blessing: the grace of Christ, the love of the Father, and the communion of the Holy Spirit. This is the Trinity as we experience it—through relationship.

John’s Gospel reminds us that God’s love is not passive: “God so loved the world that he gave his only Son.” The Trinity is love in action—self-giving, outward-reaching, life-transforming.

For us, this means that faith is not simply about belief—it is about participation. We are invited into the life of God. When we love, forgive, serve, and build unity, we reflect the Trinity.

In our parish mission—to **know, follow and share Jesus**—we are living this call.

To know Jesus is to encounter the Father.

To follow him is to receive grace.

To share him is to be guided by the Spirit.

This week, rather than trying to explain the Trinity, try to live it. Offer kindness. Build relationships. Share hope. In doing so, you reveal the God who is love.

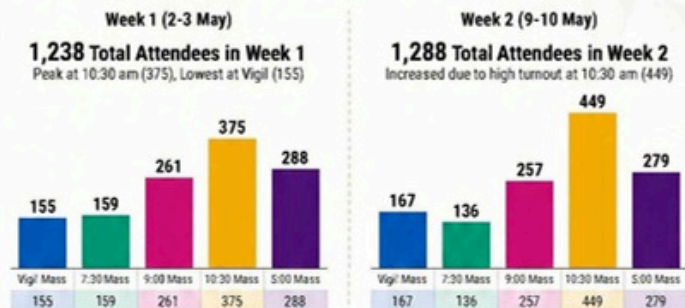

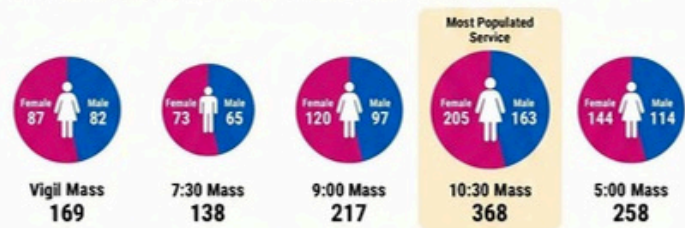
A Statistical Breakdown of Weekend Mass Attendance, Gender, and Age Distribution

WEEKS 1 & 2: TOTAL ATTENDANCE TRENDS



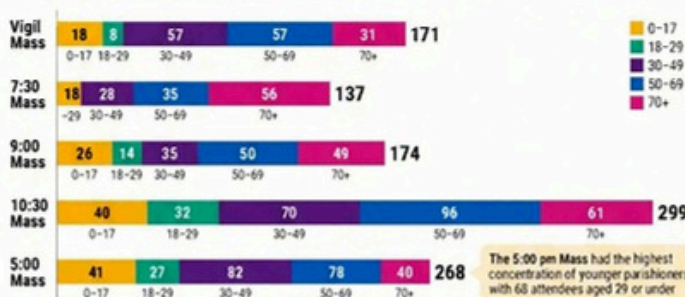
WEEK 3: GENDER BREAKDOWN (16-17 May)
