11 January 2026 (Baptism)

Presider: Brothers and sisters baptised into Christ and anointed by the Spirit, let us bring all our prayers and intentions before our loving God.

1. **For the Church**—that we embody the Servant's gentleness, strengthening crushed reeds and rekindling wavering flames in our communities.
[pause] We pray to the Lord.
2. **For leaders in Australia and beyond**—that policies pursue justice without hatred, protecting the vulnerable and promoting the common good.
[pause] We pray to the Lord.
3. **For seekers and the unchurched in our neighbourhoods**—
that, like the household of Cornelius, they hear the good news of peace in Jesus Christ and receive the Holy Spirit.
[pause] We pray to the Lord.
4. **For the sick and oppressed**—that Jesus, anointed with the Spirit and power, bring healing and hope through our care.
[pause] We pray to the Lord.
5. **For the faithful departed**—especially those recently deceased in our parish and all our loved ones: may they rest in the peace the Lord promises his people.
[pause] We pray to the Lord.

Presider: Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
you delight in your Son and bless your people with peace.
Hear our prayers and pour out your Spirit upon us,
through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Lord, have mercy.

Christ Jesus, you were anointed with the Holy Spirit to bring good news to the poor:
Christ, have mercy.

Lord Jesus, you are the Beloved Son who opens the way to the Father: Lord, have mercy.

May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins,
and lead us to the life of the age to come. Amen.
