Introduction (Emily Costello)

We are gathered here today as one family, united with our chief Shepherd of the Diocese, Bishop Brian. On behalf of Fr John and Fr Richard, seminarian Darren, St John's Parish, our catechists and the teachers from St John's we extend a very heartfelt and warm welcome to Bishop Brian.

To our Confirmation candidates: today, you stand with friends and family as a living witness to God's action. You are confirming your ongoing commitment to your Faith and being a light for all here today to see, feel and be inspired. Your Confirmation today and receiving Holy Communion completes the Christian initiation which began at your Baptism.

The Asperges – Rite for Sprinkling with Holy Water

The bishop moves to stand near the Baptismal Font. A server has the vessels to be filled with holy water.

Bishop: Water is a symbol of the Holy Spirit. In the beginning the Holy Spirit hovered over the waters and created all things. It gave life to the world. The waters of the great flood offered a new beginning of goodness, to Noah and the Ark. Through the waters of the Sea, Moses led the Israelites out of slavery to freedom. And in the waters of the River Jordan, Jesus was baptised by John and anointed with the Spirit.

When you were baptised, the Holy Spirit was given to you and you were welcomed into God's family as Children of God.

May this baptismal water remind us of the promises we made at our baptism. As we use it in this sprinkling rite, let us, through the power of God's Spirit, be healed of our brokenness and renewed in faithfulness and love.

The bishop takes water from the font and moves through the Church sprinkling the community with holy water. Music or an appropriate refrain accompanies the ritual action.

Instrumental music is played.

Upon returning the bishop goes to the font, tips the remaining water in and then returns to the chair. When all is ready he continues.

Bishop: May almighty God have mercy on us,
forgive us our sins,
and bring us to everlasting life.

All: Amen.

Gloria

Glory to God in the highest,

If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. Sacrament of Confirmation

Presentation of Candidates

Please be seated

The bishop and other ministers take their seats.

Fr John: Bishop Brian, the Parish community of St John the Evangelist, Campbelltown, presents to you the candidates for Confirmation. Along with parents and teachers, they have been involved in a careful preparation and are now ready and worthy to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Would the parents of the candidates please stand and say together:

Parents: Bishop Brian, having already presented our children to be born again in Christ through Baptism, we wish to further their initiation into the Catholic faith by presenting them now to share in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in Confirmation.

As Christian parents we wish to give them every help and encouragement we can, by our words and by our example, to practise the faith within the Church community.

(Parents please be seated)

Fr John: Would those who are to sponsor these candidates please stand and say together:

Sponsors: We are willing by our good example and prayers to be a spiritual friend, to guide, support and care for the candidate whom we will sponsor for Confirmation.

(Sponsors please be seated)

Fr John: Candidates, as your name is called, please stand and say, "Present" and remain standing.

(Candidates are called by name)

Candidate: Present.

Fr John: Bishop Brian, the parish community of St John the Evangelist, Campbelltown requests that you confirm these candidates.

Bishop Brian: I am happy to accept the candidates you have presented and to gift them with the Holy Spirit in Confirmation.

(Candidates now sit)

Homily

The bishop moves to a position in front of the altar and begins his homily, addressing the children who have gathered in front of him. When the bishop concludes his address to the children he will ask them to return to their seats. The bishop will then proceed to address the assembly.

Renewal of Baptismal Promises

After the homily, the bishop invites the candidates to stand and then questions them. The candidates respond together.

Bishop: Do you renounce Satan, and all his works and empty promises?

Candidates: **I do.**

Bishop: Do you believe in God, the Father almighty,
Creator of heaven and earth?

Candidates: **I do.**

Bishop: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered death and was buried, rose again from the dead, and is seated at the right hand of the Father?

Candidates: **I do.**

Bishop: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who today, through the Sacrament of Confirmation is given to you in a special way, just as he was given to the Apostles on the day of Pentecost?

Candidates: **I do.**

Bishop: Do you believe in the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

Candidates: **I do.**

Bishop: This is our faith. This is the faith of the Church.
We are proud to profess it in Christ Jesus our Lord.

All: **Amen.**

The Laying on of Hands

The concelebrating priests stand near the bishop. He faces the people and with hands joined says.

Bishop: Dearly beloved,
let us pray to God the almighty Father,
for these, his adopted sons and daughters,
already born again to eternal life in Baptism,
that he will graciously pour out the Holy Spirit upon them
to confirm them with his abundant gifts,
and through his anointing
conform them more fully to Christ, the Son of God.

All pray in silence for a short time.

The bishop and the priests who will minister the sacrament with him lay hands upon all the candidates (by extending their hands over them). The bishop alone says:

Bishop: Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
who brought these your servants to new birth
by water and the Holy Spirit,
freeing them from sin:
send upon them, O Lord, the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete;
give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding,
the spirit of counsel and fortitude,
the spirit of knowledge and piety;
fill them with the spirit of the fear of the Lord.
Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The Anointing with Chrism

The Chrism is brought to the bishop. The bishop goes to the individual candidates around the church. The one who presented the candidate places their right hand on the latter's shoulder and gives the candidate's name to the bishop.

The bishop dips his right thumb in the chrism and makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of the one to be confirmed, as he says:

Bishop: **[Name]**, be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit.

Candidate: Amen.

The bishop touches the cheek of the newly confirmed as a sign of peace.

Bishop: Peace be with you.

Candidate: And with your Spirit.

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After receiving the bread and wine the bishop and ministers move to the altar, where the bishop takes the vessel holding the bread, and holding it slightly above the altar, says inaudibly:

*Bishop: Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation,
for through your goodness we have received the bread we offer you:
fruit of the earth and work of human hands,
it will become for us the bread of life.*

He then places the paten with the bread on the corporal.

The priest, pours wine and a little water into the chalice, saying quietly:

*By the mystery of this water and wine
may we come to share in the divinity of Christ
who humbled himself to share in our humanity.*

Taking the chalice and holding it slightly above the altar, the bishop says inaudibly:

*Bishop: Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation,
for through your goodness we have received the wine we offer you:
fruit of the vine and work of human hands,
it will become our spiritual drink.*

Then he places the chalice on the corporal. The bishop bows and says inaudibly:

*Bishop: With humble spirit and contrite heart
may we be accepted by you, O Lord,
and may our sacrifice in your sight this day
be pleasing to you, Lord God.*

The bishop washes his hands, saying inaudibly:

*Bishop: Wash me, O Lord, from my iniquity
and cleanse me from my sin.*

Prayer over the Offerings

Please stand

Bishop: Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours
may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

**All: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands
for the praise and glory of his name,
for our good
and the good of all his holy Church.**

Bishop: Accept graciously these your servants, O Lord,
together with your Only Begotten Son,
so that, signed with his Cross and with a spiritual anointing,
they may constantly offer themselves to you
in union with him

C1 May he make of us an eternal offering to you, so that we may obtain an inheritance with your elect, especially with the most Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with blessed Joseph, her Spouse, with your blessed Apostles and glorious Martyrs with Saint John the Evangelist, and with all the Saints, on whose constant intercession in your presence we rely for unfailing help.

C2 May this Sacrifice of our reconciliation, we pray, O Lord, advance the peace and salvation of all the world. Be pleased to confirm in faith and charity your pilgrim Church on earth, with your servant **Leo** our Pope and **Brian** our Bishop, the Order of Bishops, all the clergy, and the entire people you have gained for your own.

Remember also, Lord, your servants reborn in Baptism whom you have been pleased to confirm by bestowing the Holy Spirit: in your mercy, we pray, keep safe in them your grace.

Listen graciously to the prayers of this family, whom you have summoned before you: in your compassion, O merciful Father, gather to yourself all your children scattered throughout the world.

The assembly exchanges a sign of peace. The bishop then takes the host, breaks it over the paten, and places a small piece in the chalice, saying quietly:

Bishop: May this mingling of the Body and Blood
of our Lord Jesus Christ
bring eternal life to us who receive it.

Meanwhile, the assembly prays:

All: **Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world,
have mercy on us.
Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world,
have mercy on us.
Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world,
grant us peace.**

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The bishop, with hands joined, continues inaudibly:

Please kneel

Bishop: *May the receiving of your Body and Blood,
Lord Jesus Christ,
not bring me to judgement and condemnation,
but through your loving mercy
be for me protection in mind and body
and a healing remedy.*

The bishop genuflects, takes the host and, holding it slightly raised above the paten or above the chalice, while facing the people, says aloud:

Bishop: Behold the Lamb of God,
behold him who takes away the sins of the world.
Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

**All: Lord, I am not worthy
that you should enter under my roof,
but only say the word
and my soul shall be healed.**
